# This is the last Will

and Testament of me Mark Muddock of Purced Street in  
the Parish of Saint Andrew Holborn in the County of  
Middlesex heretofore as follows first I desire all my just debts  
and funeral Charges to be paid and satisfied and I  
nominate constitute and appoint my Dear Wife Elizabeth  
Muddock and my good friend Sandy Walton of Milford  
Lane in the Parish of Saint Clement Danes to be my  
Exors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
and I give and bequeath unto my Nephew John Muddock  
and my Niece Mary Muddock (Son and Daughter of  
my Brother William Muddock) five pounds each to be paid  
them hereafter after my decease and I give and  
bequeath unto my Nephew William Muddock (Son of my  
Brother John Muddock) the Sum of five pounds and  
to each of my said Brother John Muddock's other  
Children one Guinea each and also to Elizabeth Muddock  
the Wife of my said Brother William Muddock the  
Sum of three Guineas all of which to be paid at the  
end of one Year after my decease and all the Rent  
and Residue of Money in the funds ready Money Stock  
in Trade and other Effects of what kind or nature  
soever I give and bequeath to my said Dear Wife Elizabeth  
for her own use and benefit In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and Seal this second day of  
April one thousand seven hundred and ninety one Mark  
Muddock signed sealed published and declared by the above  
named Mark Muddock as and for his last Will and  
Testament in the presence of us James Smith and Jas  
Redd at Law Charles Street Lincolns Inn

# This Will

was proved at London the sixth  
day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and ninety one before the worshipful  
George Harris Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right  
Honorable Sir William Wynne Knight also Doctor of  
Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the prerogative  
Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of  
Elizabeth Muddock Widow the Relict of the deceased and  
Sandy Walton the Executor named in the said Will  
to whom Administration was granted of all and singular  
the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased  
having been first sworn duly to Administer

On the sixth day of October in the Year of our Lord  
one thousand seven hundred and ninety two Administration  
with the Will annexed of all and singular the Goods  
Chattels and Credits of Mark Muddock late of Purced  
Street in the Parish of Saint Andrew Holborn in the

County of Middlesex & goods left unadministered by  
Elizabeth Phillips formerly Muddock the Debet of the  
said Robert and Sandy Walton the Executors named  
in the said Will were also devised was granted  
to Noale Phillips the husband and administrator of the  
Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Elizabeth Phillips  
formerly Muddock the Debetary deputed named in  
the said Will having been first sworn duly to  
administer the said Elizabeth Phillips formerly Muddock  
survived the said Sandy Walton and died intestate in  
Ed.

one thousand pounds of lawful Money of Great  
Britain and do appoint my aforesaid wife and my  
Brother Row Cordy my Executors of this my last will  
and Testament Item I give to my Brother David  
Mians the sum of twenty pounds of lawful Money  
of Great Britain Item I give to my sister Elizabeth  
the sum of twenty pounds of lawful  
Money of Great Britain

Item I give to my  
sister Susan Wells the sum of twenty pounds of lawful  
Money of Great Britain Item I give to my Sister  
Elizabeth Conger the sum of twenty pounds of  
lawful Money of Great Britain Item I give to my  
two Daughters Elizabeth and Ester Daughters of my  
deceased Brother John Mians the sum of twenty  
pounds each of lawful Money of Great Britain Item  
I give and bequeath to my Dearly beloved wife all  
the residue of my Estate to be by her freely possessed  
and enjoyed and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke  
and disannull all and every other former Testaments  
will devises Bequests and Executors by me in any  
way before named wills and bequeathes notwithstanding
